Who is this Infosheet for?

This Infosheet is designed to give referral and contact information for Community Legal Centres (CLCs) operating in Victoria, specifically those assisting with **family and domestic violence and related legal matters.** CLCs are independent organisations providing free or low-cost legal assistance to members of the community, including legal advice and casework services as well as education and advocacy. If you are unable to afford private legal representation or assistance, CLCs may be able to help you with your legal matter.

If you or another person are at immediate risk of harm, call 000.

Please note that **a number of CLCs have closed their offices** or are not currently operating or operating with a reduced capacity due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. <u>You should not attempt to visit a CLC's office without checking to see if they are</u> <u>currently open and should not do so if it would be a breach of current COVID-19</u> <u>isolation or lockdown laws.</u> Check the relevant CLC's website for more information and call or email before attending an office.
