IF YOU ARE IN AFGHANISTAN AND HAVE CONNECTIONS TO AUSTRALIA

The following notification was posted to the **DFAT Smart Traveller site** current as of 27 August2021.

Australian evacuation flights from Kabul have ceased, and all Australian Government personnel have left Kabul. There's an ongoing and very high threat of terrorist attack. Explosions have occurred in the vicinity of the Kabul Hamid Karzai International Airport. Do not travel to the airport. If you're in the area, move to a safe location. The situation in Afghanistan remains highly volatile and dangerous. Be aware of the potential for violence and security threats with large crowds. Take all extra precautions for your safety. Remain vigilant and be aware of your surroundings.

Our ability to provide consular assistance to Australians remaining in Afghanistan is severely limited. Australian citizens, permanent residents and their immediate families should register with DFAT: <u>https://covid19.dfat.gov.au</u>. Australians in need of consular assistance should contact the Australian Government 24-hour Consular Emergency Centre on 1300 555 135 in Australia or +61 2 6261 3305 outside Australia.

Information regarding limited options for visas to travel to Australia

There are few options for lodging humanitarian visas for those currently in Afghanistan.

- The Government has only allocated 3000 visa places at this stage for Afghan refugees.
- Holders or applicants for SHEV or TPV in Australia are prevented from sponsoring family members by the conditions of those programs but can still be named as a family member in their relative's application.
- Those people in Afghanistan with Australian permanent resident or citizen partners or children may be eligible to lodge family reunion applications.
- Humanitarian Stay Visas (Subclass 449) were also being granted in Afghanistan, however these may have ended when evacuations ceased and are only available at the invitation of the Australian Government and are not open for application

• Persons in Afghanistan can still contact **Awaaz Afghanistan** which provides a toll-free, countrywide hotline number (410) that affected populations can dial to access information. For

- Individuals with ties to foreign governments, embassies, military, NGOs are advised to consult with those foreign entities to understand any opportunities for departure from insideor outside Afghanistan.

RACS can provide advice and support for people lodging visa applications (including Fast Track) and appeals to the Administrative Appeals Tribunal. RACS does not provide advice about Judicial Review (i.e. appeals to the courts). From July 2016 RACS will be running judicial review clearinghouse service for Fast Track IAA refusals with client intake preferably via a person's SRSS caseworker.

Legal Aid gives advice on detention, removal, cancellation procedures and exclusion periods.

Immigration Advice and Rights Centre (IARC)
