What is ASVET?

ASVET is a Victorian State Government funded initiative which supports eligible people seeking asylum, and refugees, to gain access to Skills First Victoria' Skills First VET courses at a subsidised rate.

To enrol candidates must hold either Bridging Visa E, (BVE) Temporary Protection Visa (TPV), Safe Haven Enterprise Visa (SHEV) or **Humanitarian Stay (Temporary) (Subclass 449) - new 2022**

Eligible people may enrol in Skills First certificates in:

- Foundation Studies (EAL, VCE)
- VET Certificate levels I to IV
- Diplomas and Advanced Diplomas

Enrolment

- Can enrol directly as an ASVET student with an RTO offering Skills First to access subsidised places, Job Trainer or Free TAFE for Priority courses.
- ASRC can provide a letter of introduction if requested
- Adult, Community and Further Education (ACFE) enrolment through Jobs Victoria
- Program values supporting people seeking asylum to make informed choices about their education pathway options

ASRC Activities

Advisory appointments:

- One on one with Education advisors goals, planning, logistics and financial impact
- Navigate funding initiatives
- Liaising with Training Organisations (RTOs) as needed
- Follow up





Course types




Ages of applicants
