HOW TO RESPOND TO TRIBUNAL REQUESTS FOR HEARING INFORMATION



WHY IS THE TRIBUNAL ASKING FOR THIS INFORMATION?

The Tribunal asks for information ahead of a hearing to better understand your case and your needs.

It's important to have legal assistance to prepare your case. If you do not have a representative and are unable to get advice on response, you can consider taking the steps below.

We recommend having legal representation before the Tribunal if you are able. Information on accessing ASRC assistance is <u>here</u>, and our legal referral sheet including other providers is <u>here</u>.

HOW SHOULD I RESPOND?

The most important thing is to respond with key information about your needs at the hearing, and to seek legal support as soon as possible.

If you are unsure how to complete the form, you can reply by email. The suggestions below may assist you.

Dear Registry,
