### Free Legal Help

If you need of legal assistance and/or representation and can't afford to pay for a lawyer, you can call the following telephone advice lines:

Refugee Legal specialises in free legal advice and representation in relation to protection visas, visa cancellation and general immigration matters at primary and merits review stages.

#### [Victoria Legal Aid \(VLA\)](#)

Victoria Legal Aid's (VLA) Migration Team specialises in free legal advice and representation to people who are seeking merits review of a decision to refuse or cancel a protection visa in the Administrative Review Tribunal (ART), or judicial review in the federal courts. VLA also has specialist criminal, family and civil teams that can provide advice and assistance with other legal issues.

### Paid Legal Services

Private lawyers may be able to assist you with advice and/or representation. They will charge fees for their assistance, called legal fees or professional fees. It is very important that you receive ethical and informed advice, as poor advice can be very damaging. We recommend you get advice from a firm that has a Law Institute Accredited Immigration Law Specialist employed.

A lawyer needs to follow certain rules when assisting you, including clear communication about costs. You are not obliged to continue with services you are not happy with.

The ASRC recommends the lawyers below for assistance in relation to:

- Protection visa applications and interviews at the Department of Home Affairs;
- Administrative Review Tribunal applications;
- Federal Court and High Court applications and hearings;
- Humanitarian requests to the Minister of Immigration;
- Family visas, skilled visas, work visas and student visas;
- Complex health and character matters; and
- Visa cancellations and responses to adverse information.
